Introduction Agenda

- Explain that the purpose of the hearing is to accept public comment on a major disposal or diversion of parkland that is under consideration;
- Describe the proposed disposal or diversion, including the lands affected, the total acreage of parkland to be affected and the project for which the disposal or diversion is sought;
- Set forth the compelling public need that the project would fulfill, the significant public benefit it would yield, or the exceptional recreational and/or conservation benefit it would provide; and
- Discuss past and ongoing efforts to identify alternatives to the proposed disposal or diversion considered by the local government unit or nonprofit and the reason(s) for rejecting any alternatives, and, to the extent known, the compensation that the local government unit or nonprofit would provide for the proposed disposal or diversion; and
- Accept comment on any alternative sites suggested by the public and on alternative methods of achieving its project objectives without the diversion or disposal of parkland.

Introduction Project's History

- By 1967 Manchester Township owned the Municipal Complex property (1 Colonial Drive; Block 48, Lot 1)
- 1997 Hockey rink was constructed (encompassing a 0.46 ac portion of the property)
- 2010 Hockey rink area was first listed on the Township's Recreation and Open Space Inventory (ROSI), under the rules of the Garden State Preservation Trust (GSPT)
- Hockey rink has not been used for about 10 years and has fallen into a state of disrepair
- Since at least 2014 Township has been considering the expansion of the municipal complex and diversion
 of the hockey rink

Proposed Project Need & Scope

- The existing municipal complex is not sufficient to house and accommodate the expanding functions of the Township offices, staff and services
- Due to space needs, the Police Department has used the area adjacent to the abandoned hockey rink as police impoundment
 - Public access to the area is restricted due to security needs
- Expansion of the municipal complex
 - This will likely include parking lot expansion
 - It may include an addition to the building/ structures

Proposed Project Alternatives

Alternatives for the Police Impound Lot


- 1. Department of Public Works garage
- 2. Recycling Center
 - Reasons for rejecting both: insufficient space and Pinelands regulations forbidding the taking of additional impervious land

Alternatives for the expansion of the Municipal Complex

- 1. Development of Block 38, Lot 20 (parcel across Colonial Dr from town hall)
 - Reason for rejecting: ongoing litigation with the developer
- 2. Acquisition/development of Block 48, Lot 2, Ocean County library parcel adjacent to town hall
 - Reason for rejecting: not favorable to the County
- 3. Development of Township-owned Block 48, Lot 6 adjacent property to the west
 - Reason for rejecting: encumbered by wetlands that would prohibit or severely limit development

Proposed Project Concept

 Preliminary concept shows the existing, unused hockey rink as a space providing Police Department impoundment and vehicle parking for municipal complex function



Proposed Property to be Diverted Township Hockey Rink, p/o Block 48, Lot 1

- Details
 - 0.46 acres of Block 48, Lot 1
 - Located on the Municipal Complex property
 - Tax assessor value the 0.46 acres at \$56,800
- Purpose
 - Hockey rink has not been used for many years
 - There is no recreation need in town for the hockey rink
 - Municipal Complex expansion planned
 - Diverted area will likely be parking for the Municipal Complex




















Compensation Land Block 37, Lot 3.01

- Details
 - 2.00 acres
 - In the R10 zone
 - Assessed for \$220,000
- Appropriateness
 - Adjacent to existing recreation/open space use
 - Manchester Hawks Youth Football and Cheer complex (formerly Pop Warner)
