CONSTRUCT, CONNECT,

AN ORDINANCE GRANTING RENEWAL OF MUNICIPAL CONSENT TO COMCAST OF NEW JERSEY, LLC. TO CONSTRUCT, CONNECT, OPERATE AND MAINTAIN A CABLE TELEVISION AND COMMUNICATIONS SYSTEM IN THE MUNICAPALITY OF MANCHESTER, OCEAN COUNTY, NEW JERSEY

BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE TOWNSHIP OF MANCHESTER, OCEAN COUNTY, NEW JERSEY, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. PURPOSE OF THE ORDINANCE.

The Township hereby grants to Comcast renewal of its non-exclusive Municipal Consent to place in, upon, across, above, over and under highways, streets alleys, sidewalks, easements, public ways and public places in the Township, poles, wires, cables, underground conduits, manholes and other television conductors, fixtures, apparatus, and equipment as may be necessary for the construction, operation and maintenance in the Township of a cable television and communications system.

SECTION 2. DEFINITIONS.

For the purpose of this Ordinance, the following terms, phrases, words and their derivations shall have the meaning given herein. Such meaning or definition of terms in supplemental to those definitions of the Federal Communications Commission ("FCC") rules and regulations, 47 <u>C.F.R.</u> Subsection 76.1 <u>et seq.</u>, and the Cable Communications Policy Act, 47 <u>U.S.C.</u> Section 521 <u>et seq.</u>, as amended, and the Cable Television Act, <u>N.J.S.A.</u> § 48:5A-1 <u>et seq.</u>, and shall in no way be construed to broaden, alter or conflict with the federal and state definitions:

- a. "Township" or "Municipality" is the Township of Manchester, County of Ocean, State of New Jersey.
- b. "Company" or "Comcast" is the grantee of rights under this Ordinance and is known as Comcast of New Jersey, LLC.
- c. "Act" or "Cable Television Act" is Chapter 186 of the General Laws of New Jersey, and subsequent amendments thereto, N.J.S.A. § 48:5A-1, et seq.
- d. "FCC" is the Federal Communications Commission.
- e. "Board" or 'BPU" is the Board of Public Utilities, State of New Jersey.
- f. "Office" or "OCTV" is the Office of Cable Television of the Board.
- g. "Basic Cable Service" means any service tier, which includes the retransmission of local television broadcast signals as defined by the FCC.
- h. "Application" is the Company's Application for Renewal of Municipal

Consent.

i. "Primary Service Area" or 'PSA" consists of the area of the Township currently served with existing plant as set forth in the map annexed to the Company's Application for Municipal Consent.

SECTION 3. STATEMENT OF FINDINGS.

There have previously been two cable television communication system franchises operating within the Township of Manchester. One operating within the Township of Manchester and another operating and granted within the Crestwood Village residential development. The former Crestwood Village franchise approval is now subsumed into the Township's municipal consent franchise for the entire municipality from the date of adoption of this ordinance forward, there shall be one municipal consent for the operation of a cable television and communication system within the Township of Manchester.

A public hearing concerning the consent herein granted to the Company was held after proper public notice pursuant to the terms and conditions of the Act. Said hearing having been held and fully open to the public, and the municipality having received all comments regarding the qualifications of the Company to receive this consent, and the representations of the Company that the Company possesses the necessary legal, technical, character, financial and other qualifications and that the Company's operating and construction arrangements are adequate and feasible.

SECTION 4. DURATION OF FRANCHISE.

The non-exclusive Municipal Consent granted herein shall expire ten (10) years from the effective date of the Certificate of Approval.

In the event that the Municipality shall find that the Company has not substantially complied with the material terms and conditions of this Ordinance, the Municipality shall have the right to petition the OCTV, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 48:5A-47, for appropriate action, including modification and/or termination of the Certificate of Approval; provided however, that the Municipality shall first have given the Company written notice of all alleged instances of non-compliance and an opportunity to cure same within ninety (90) days of that notification.

SECTION 5. FRANCHISE FEE.

Pursuant to the terms and conditions of the Act, and, except as where higher payment is otherwise required by the applicable law and regulations (including N.J.S.A. 48:5A-30), the Company shall, during each year of operation under the consent granted herein, pay to the Township two percent (2%) of the gross revenues from all recurring charges in the nature of subscription fees paid by subscribers for cable television reception service in the Township or any higher amount permitted by the Act or otherwise allowable by law.



The consent granted under this Ordinance for the renewal of the franchise shall apply to the entirety of the Township and any property subsequently annexed hereto.

SECTION 7. EXTENSION OF SERVICE.

The Company shall be required to proffer service to any residence and business along any public right-of-way in the Primary Service Area, as set forth in the Company's Application. Any extension of plant beyond the Primary Service Area shall be governed by the Company's Line Extension Policy, as set forth in the Company's Application, with a HPM ("homes-per-mile") of 35 dwellings per linear mile from the nearest active trunk or feeder line from which a usable cable signal may be obtained. For purposes of this section and the Company's implementation of the LEP, a home shall only be counted as a "dwelling unit" if such home is occupied and within two hundred seventy-five (275) feet of the public right of way.

SECTION 8. CONSTRUCTION REQUIREMENTS.

- a. Restoration: In the event that the Company or its agents shall disturb any pavement, street surfaces, sidewalks, driveways, or other surface in the natural topography, the Company shall, at its sole expense, restore and replace such places or things so disturbed in as reasonably good a condition as existed prior to the commencement of said work.
- b. Relocation: If at any time during the period of this consent, the Township shall alter or change the grade of any street, alley or other way or place the Company, upon reasonable notice by the Township, shall remove, re-lay or relocate its equipment, at the expense of the Company. In requiring Company to remove, re-lay or relocate any portion of its property, the Township shall treat Company the same as, and require no more of Company than, any other similarly situated entity utilizing the Public Rights of Way, including with respect to reimbursement of costs.
- c. Removal or Trimming of Trees: During the exercise of its rights and privileges under this franchise, the Company shall have the authority to trim trees upon and overhanging streets, alleys, sidewalks or other public places of the Township so as to prevent the branches of such trees from coming in contact with the wires and cable of the Company. Such trimming shall be only to the extent necessary to maintain proper clearance of the Company's wire and cables.
- d. Installation of Equipment: The Company shall install equipment in the same location and manner as existing public utilities whenever possible, in order to minimize the impact of same on surrounding property.

SECTION 9. CUSTOMER SERVICE.

In providing services to its customers, the Company shall comply with <u>N.J.A.C.</u> 14:18-1, <u>et seq</u>. and all applicable state and federal statutes and regulations. The Company shall strive to meet or exceed all voluntary company and industry standards in the delivery of customer service.

- a. The Company shall continue to comply fully with all applicable state and federal statutes and regulations regarding credit for outages, the reporting of same to regulatory agencies and notification of same to customers.
- b. The Company shall continue to fully comply with all applicable state and federal statutes and regulations regarding the availability of devices for the hearing impaired and the notification of same to customers.

SECTION 10. MUNICIPAL COMPLAINT OFFICER.

The Office of Cable Television is hereby designated as the Complaint Officer for the Township pursuant to N.J.S.A. § 48:5A-26(b). All complaints shall be received and processed in accordance with N.J.A.C. § 14:17-6.5. The Township shall have the right to request copies of records and reports pertaining to complaints by Township customers from the OCTV.

SECTION 11. LOCAL OFFICE.

During the term of this franchise, and any renewal thereof, the Company shall maintain a business office or agent in accordance with <u>N.J.A.C.</u> § 14:18-5.1 for the purpose of receiving, investigating and resolving all local complaints regarding the quality of service, equipment malfunctions, and similar matters.

SECTION 12. PERFORMANCE BOND.

During the life of the franchise the Company shall give to the Township a bond in the amount of Twenty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000). Such bond shall be to insure the faithful performance of all undertakings of the Company as represented in its application for municipal consent incorporated herein.

SECTION 13. SUBSCRIBER RATES.

The rates of the Company shall be subject to regulation as permitted by federal and state law.

SECTION 14. COMMITMENTS BY THE COMPANY.

a. The parties agree that Comcast will provide basic cable service at no cost to one (1) outlet in Township Hall, First Aids, Fire Departments, Community Center, and Library provided that the building is within two hundred (200) feet of active cable distribution plant or

through customer owned conduit. Each additional outlet installed, if any, shall be paid for on a materials plus labor basis by the school requesting service.

- b. The parties agree that Comcast will provide basic cable service at no cost to one (1) outlet in the Township's public and private, elementary, intermediate and secondary, provided the school building is within two hundred (200) feet of active cable distribution plant or through customer owned conduit. Each additional outlet installed, if any, shall be paid for on a materials plus labor basis by the school requesting service.
- c. The Communications Act of 1934, as amended [47 U.S.C. § 543 (b)], allows the Company to itemize and/or identify: (1.) the amount on the subscriber bill assessed as a franchise fee and the identity of the governmental authority to which the fee is paid; (2.) the amount on the bill assessed to satisfy any requirements imposed on the Company by the cable franchise to support public, education, and/or governmental access channels or the use of such channels; and (3.) any grants or other fees on the bill or any tax, assessment, or charge of any kind imposed by any governmental authority on the transaction between the operator and the subscriber. The Company reserves its external cost, pass-through rights to the full extent permitted by law.

SECTION 15. EDUCATION AND GOVERNMENTAL ACCESS

- a. The Company shall make available to the Township one government access channel and two educational access channels.
- b. The Company does not relinquish its ownership of or ultimate right of control over a channel by designating it for access use. An EG access user whether an educational or government user acquires no property or other interest by virtue of the use of a channel so designated and may not rely on the continued use of a particular channel number, no matter how long the same channel may have been designated for such use.
- c. The Company will maintain the cable, modulators, and equipment necessary for the Township or its designee to send a signal to the Company, and to receive the return feed of the signal.
- d. The Company shall not exercise editorial control over any educational or governmental use of channel capacity, except Company may refuse to transmit any educational or governmental access program or portion of any educational or governmental access program that contains obscenity, indecency, or nudity.
- e. Government Access. "Government Access" shall mean noncommercial use by the Township for the purpose of showing the local government at work.
- f. Company Use of Fallow Time. Because blank or underutilized E/G channels are not in the public interest, in the event the Township or other qualified E/G access users elect not to

fully program their E/G access channel, Company may program unused time on those channels subject to reclamation by the Township upon no less than 60 days written notice.

- g. Indemnification. The Township shall indemnify Company for any liability, loss, or damage it may suffer due to violation of the intellectual property rights of third parties on the EG channel and from claims arising out of the rules for or administration of E/G access channel and its programming.
- h. Within six months of the issuance of a Renewal Certificate of Approval by the BPU, the Company shall provide to the Township a one-time E/G Access Capital Grant in the amount of \$45,000 to meet the E/G Access capital needs of the community.
- i. The Communications Act of 1934, as amended [47 U.S.C. §543 (b)], allows the Company to itemize and/or identify: (1.) the amount on the subscriber bill assessed as a franchise fee and the identity of the governmental authority to which the fee is paid; (2.) the amount on the bill assessed to satisfy any requirements imposed on the Company by the cable franchise to support public, education, and/or governmental access channels or the use of such channels; and (3.) any grants or other fees on the bill or any tax, assessment, or charge of any kind imposed by any governmental authority on the transaction between the operator and the subscriber. The Company reserves its external cost, pass-through rights to the full extent permitted by law.

SECTION 16. EMERGENCY USES.

- a. The Company will comply with the Emergency Alert System ("EAS") rules in accordance with applicable state and federal statutes and regulations.
- b. The Company shall in no way be held liable for any injury suffered by the Township or any other person, during an emergency, if for any reason the Township is unable to make full use of the cable television system as contemplated herein.

SECTION 17. LIABILITY INSURANCE.

The Company shall at all times maintain a comprehensive general liability insurance policy with a single limit amount of One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) covering liability for any death, personal injury, property damages or other liability arising out of its construction and operation of the cable television system, and an excess liability (or "umbrella") policy in the amount of Five Million Dollars (\$5,000,000).

SECTION 18. INCORPORATION OF THE APPLICATION.

All of the statements and commitments contained in the Application or annexed thereto and incorporated therein, and any amendment thereto, except as modified herein, are binding upon the Company as terms and conditions of this consent ordinance, the Application and other relevant

writings submitted by the Company shall be annexed hereto and made a part hereof by reference provided same do not conflict with application State or Federal law.

SECTION 19. COMPETITIVE EQUITY.

Should the Township grant municipal consent for a franchise to construct, operate and maintain a cable television system to any other person, corporation or entity on terms materially less burdensome or more favorable than the terms contained herein, the Company may substitute such language that is more favorable or less burdensome for the comparable provision of this Ordinance subject to the provisions of

N.J.A.C. § 14:17-6.7.

SECTION 20. SEPARABILITY.

If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this Ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by any court or federal or state agency of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision, and its validity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of the Ordinance.

SECTION 21. PROPRIETARY INFORMATION

The Company shall not be required to disclose information which it reasonably deems to be proprietary or confidential in nature. The Township agrees to treat any information disclosed by the Company as confidential and only to disclose it to those employees, representatives, and agents of the Township that have a need to know in order to enforce this Ordinance Agreement and who agree to maintain the confidentiality of all such information.

The Company shall not be required to provide Customer information in violation of Section 631 of the Cable Act or any other applicable federal or state privacy law. For purposes of this Section, the terms "proprietary or confidential" include, but are not limited to, information relating to the Cable System design, customer lists, marketing plans, financial information unrelated to the calculation of franchise fees or rates pursuant to FCC rules, or other information that is reasonably determined by the Company to be competitively sensitive. The Company may make proprietary or confidential information available for inspection but not copying or removal by the Municipality's representative. In the event that the Municipality has in its possession and receives a request under a state "sunshine," public records, or similar law for the disclosure of information the Company has designated as confidential, trade secret or proprietary, the Township shall notify the Company of such request and cooperate with Company in opposing such request.

SECTION 22. FORCE MAJEURE.

The Company shall not be liable or responsible for, in whole or in part, any delay or failure to perform any of its obligations hereunder which may result from accidents, pandemics, floods, fires, earthquakes, tornadoes or other acts of God; war, acts of war (whether or not a declaration of war is made), civil disobedience; civil disturbance, sabotage or vandalism, customer tampering or

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interference, or act of public enemy; strikes, other labor or job actions or unavailability of materials or equipment; or other events or circumstances beyond the reasonable control of the Company.

SECTION 23. THIRD PARTY BENEFICIARIES.

Nothing in this Franchise or in any prior agreement is or was intended to confer third-party beneficiary status on any member of the public to enforce the terms of such agreements or Franchise.

SECTION 24. NEW DEVELOPMENTS

The Municipality, for its part, shall endeavor to exercise reasonable efforts to require developers and utility companies to provide the Company with at least fifteen (15) days advance notice of an available open trench for the placement of necessary cable.

SECTION 25. EFFECTIVE DATE.

This Ordinance shall take effect upon the issuance of a Renewal Certificate of Approval from the BPU and shall be in effect from ten years of the date thereof.

§ 430-29. Schedule of Water and Sewer rates for Eastern Service Area

B. Connection Fees

- (1) In accordance with N.J.S.A. 40A:31-11, the initial fees to connect directly or indirectly to the Township's Eastern Service Area water supply system shall include a connection fee, which shall be set at \$5,663.65 per ESU. In the case of affordable housing units, the connection fee shall be 50% per ESU. Connection fees shall be paid at the rate in effect when a building permit is applied for and granted.
- (2) In accordance with N.J.S.A. 40A:26A-11, the initial fees to connect directly or indirectly to the Township's Eastern Service Area sanitary sewer system shall include a connection fee, which shall be set at \$2,564.62 per ESU. In the case of affordable housing units, the connection fee shall be 50% ESU. Connection fees shall be paid at the rate in effect when a building permit is applied for and granted.

F. Fixed service charges.

Quarterly fixed service charges shall be based on the ESUs or meter size as determined under provisions of Subsection A. Service charges shall be paid separately for water and sewer service. No water gallonage allowance shall be included in the water service charge. Fixed service charges will take effect upon installation of the water meter, nine months after the installation of the water service line, or 12 months after payment of the connection fee. Fixed service charges shall be prorated for the number of days in the quarters of initial establishment and permanent discontinuance of service. Fixed service charges shall be prorated for the number of days in the quarters of initial establishment and permanent discontinuance of service. RESOLUTION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF MANCHESTER, COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, OPPOSING THE STATE OF NEW JERSEY'S MISAPPROPRIATION OF 9-1-1 SYSTEM FEES

WHEREAS, the citizens of Ocean County and the State of New Jersey rely on an effective, reliable, and modern 9-1-1 emergency communications system to protect life, property, and public safety; and

WHEREAS, the State of New Jersey imposes a monthly surcharge on telephone bills pursuant to the "Enhanced 9-1-1 System and Emergency Response Fee" law, N.J.S.A. 52:17C-18 et seq., with the stated purpose of funding the operation, maintenance, and advancement of the State's 9-1-1 system; and

WHEREAS, since the establishment of the 9-1-1 System Fee in 2004, the State of New Jersey has collected billions of dollars from New Jersey residents through this surcharge; and

WHEREAS, despite these collections, numerous reports - including those by the New Jersey Association of Counties (NJAC), the Federal Communications Commission (FCC), and the State's own audits-have consistently shown that the State has diverted the overwhelming majority of these funds for non-9-1-1 related purposes; and

WHEREAS, as a result of this diversion, Counties and municipalities have been forced to bear the financial burden of maintaining and upgrading local Public Safety Answering Points (PSAPs), radio communications systems, and 9-1-1 dispatch technology - costs that were intended to be covered by these user fees; and

WHEREAS, according to NJAC data, less than 10% of the revenue collected from the State's 9-1-1 System Fee is actually reinvested in County and local 9-1-1 operations, with the remaining funds diverted to other areas of the State budget; and

WHEREAS, this practice has hindered local governments' ability to implement necessary technological upgrades such as Next Generation 9-1-1 (NG9-1-1). interoperability enhancements, and cybersecurity improvements critical to emergency communications; and

WHEREAS, the FCC has repeatedly ranked New Jersey among the worst offenders in the nation for diverting citing the State's continued non-compliance with federal standards for proper use of emergency system funds; and

WHEREAS, the Township of Manchester of the County of Ocean supports the New Jersey Association of Counties' ongoing advocacy to end the diversion of 9-1-1 fees and ensure that all funds collected are dedicated exclusively to enhancing and supporting emergency communications infrastructure at the State, County, and local levels.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE TOWNSHIP OF MANCHESTER, OF THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, strongly opposes the continued misappropriation and diversion of 9-1-1 System Fees by the State of New Jersey and urges the Governor and the New Jersey Legislature to enact reforms ensuring that all funds collected from these fees are used solely for their intended purpose to support, maintain, and improve 9-1-1 emergency response systems throughout the State.
