COUNCIL REPORTS:

Ms. Drake – Congratulations to the Manchester Middle School choir. They got to perform with Foreigner.

Mr. Vaccaro – Thank you Madam President. As always, a warm welcome and thank you for your attendance, and continued interest in our management. Please remember we have pride in Manchester Township, your home and residence and the Gemstone of the Jersey Shore aka Gateway of the Jersey Shore.

On 7/14 – I attended the Renaissance meeting. 7/21 – myself, the Business Administrator and Al Yodakis participated in a NJOPA zoom meeting to discuss the master plan. 7/21 – along with Council President Zolezi attended the bi-weekly meeting. 7/23 – attended a disaster plan review meeting. 7/23- zoning board meeting. 7/24 – I attended the funeral of Kevin Sloan of the Whiting Fire Department.

Quick notes, in the near future with commercial and industrial, the Master Plan was revisited embarking with the traffic study. We should also address our 10-year energy plan. Also look into large floatable solar on bodies of water. We should stimulate new businesses while spreading the tax burden to commercial from the residents. We should have smart growth while keeping the town rural and more affordable. We should consider an ordinance waiving fees for small business to relocate to our town and we should restart the shop local program.

Lastly, market and attract establishing a much-needed health care village and senior citizen and youth center. In closing, one act of kindness by you changes all aspects and puts a smile on someone’s face. Thank you, madam president and God Bless America and the residents of Manchester Township!

Mr. Wallis – First, congratulations to the new officers. The chief is great in going out and finding great new officers. Thanks Chief, incredible assets. With Bowker Field, I wanted to mention how immaculate and great shape it's in. No Trash, the playground has no rust and is in great condition. Great job by AI and the public works department. Congratulations Shannon and good luck Maria and congratulations.

Mrs. Noonan – Thank you Maria for everything. I will miss you. Congratulations to the officers, we have the best police. Chief – can you explain to the public the Flock Cameras?

Chief – Flock is a vendor auto license plate reader. We don't have any owned by Manchester Township. Some are privately owned by businesses. We have access to the cameras if needed but they are not owned by us. The recent controversy in other towns is that they are selling the information.

Judy – I have been getting questions on data centers. I have not heard anything on this.

Carl – one location has been approved for a warehouse, and they are considering a portion for a data center, but they are looking into it and obtaining information on it.

Judy – there's a local politician, that I will not mention, trying to make Manchester a metropolitan area. I realize we have to have visions, but we need to keep it rural. We could use a food store, restaurant and maybe a car wash but we have buildings that are empty. Contractors don't care. Some disagree, but we needed the radio tower and it had to go up. We can still keep it rural. Let's develop businesses in buildings that are here already. The concert was really good. The Hawaiian luau is July 31st.

Councilman Wallis – Yes, recently Mayor Fressola passed away. He was a great advocate for this town.

Judy to Carl – the park on Route 571, is there any update?

Carl – The county park portion is under the permitting process. Maybe another year.

Ms. Zolezi – Congratulations to the new officers. Council President thanked Municipal Clerk Teri Giercyk and her staff for their professionalism and noted that residents can rely on the Clerk's office for accurate information. Congratulations Maria and also to Shannon and Emilie. The recreation department is doing a wonderful job. The Luau is on Friday. Now that summer is here, be careful with the heat and the storms. Be mindful of neighbors.

Carl Block – First, the mayor asked me to notify everyone that there will be drainage work on Commonwealth, and it will be closed for about a week. With finance, we received a LEAP grant for \$150,000.00. Radios for the school and police and fire upgrade with phones. The tax maps are back to the state for final approval. Digital zoning maps went to Pinelands for approval.

Jeannette Larrison – With the tax bills, we are sending out estimated bills to go out early next week with an extension. The final bills will be in September.

Chief Ellis – As mentioned, there will be a detour on Commonwealth. National Night Out will be held on August 12th in conjunction with Lakehurst and Joint Base. On August 22nd there is a car show.

PUBLIC:

Gail Apgar – Columbus Blvd. – Flock cameras. Approximately one to one and half years ago, they came to our CCM meeting and encouraged us to put cameras up. In the Whiting Center, the Acorn thrift store is expanding. That is good news. AI centers, if they come, the electricity and water should be on their own.

Carl explained the size of some AI centers, but not anything coming here with that size.

Gail – did I hear a fast-food restaurant is coming to Rt. 530? Also, near Fox Hollow near Harry Wright Lake, Pershing and Lake Road is gravel and they speed down that road. Maybe we could put up signs.

Karen Argenti – Clear Lake Rd. – Teri is terrific and so is Carl. About the data center at the Stavola property, it was already voted on by the Pinelands. It is included in the 2025 amended development plan. The Pinelands sent letter approving amended plans to include data center. I was on the Environmental Commission until I was thrown off by the new administration. The rumors are true. You need to have a staff person sitting in the office to answer questions. Our Engineer is also our Planner. I think as a council, you should look into this information and get a planner. Brick has a full-time in-house planner.

Carl – It is quite normal to contract out a planner. Our planner is Colliers and our engineer is CME.

The Pinelands instructed where to build and knock down trees with Stavola property and not build on the site of the old mine but the area next to it.

Karen Argenti- With Route 70, Brick did a great job. If someone works in more than one town, where is their allegiance?

Council President – thank you for your comments.

Joe Markowski – Eleanor Rd. – I have two questions. To Chief – why are they washing out turning signals on the road?
Chief – the DOT is resurfacing the roads. Applying a top coat.
Joe – Second question, with the water restrictions, how long will it be?

Michele- when the drought is over.
Carl – Our PW supervisor is keeping an eye on it. When the peak demand hours and with the heat, the water levels are low. Probably towards the end of the summer.

There being no further comments or business to come before Council at this time, motion to adjourn meeting at 7:26 p.m. upon a motion by Councilman Vaccaro, seconded by Councilwoman Noonan and approved by the following Roll call vote: Councilmembers Drake, Vaccaro, Wallis, Noonan, and Zolezi; yea.
